I call your attention to our next program-on Shaker Barns. Although the Shakers did not build Dutch Barns, much of their architecture, including nearly all of their early Meeting Houses, are based on Dutch Framing. They were innovators in Barn Design, and many of their barns were spectacular. The Shaker Church Family Barn at the Watervliet site in Colonie was built 100 years ago to replace an earlier barn that burned.


## Sunday, 16 August 2015, 2 PM Program on Shaker Barns:

His book concentrates on the remarkable multi-level dairy barns built by the Shakers from Maine to Western New York in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Two of the best documented barns were built in at the Watervliet Site [in what is now Colonie]
